When applying for a private visa with the form made out to the Ambassador, it is required to provide original birth certificate with a translation into Russian language done by a sworn interpreter + copy of the original document and a translation. It is not required to notarize the translation in the Russian Consulate.

Extra additional documents for those applicants who have chosen the second type of the invitation (a written application from a citizen of the Russian Federation made out to the director of the Embassy of the Russian Federation in The Netherlands):

- 1. Valid Russian Foreign Passport of the applicant-Russian citizen + copy
- 2. Document confirming legal residency of the applicant-Russian citizen in the Netherlands (visa, residence permit, passport) + copy
- 3. Documents proving the relationship to the applicant-Russian citizen (marriage certificate, birth certificate) + copy
